
Stornoway is a <u>town</u> on the <u>Isle of Lewis</u>, in the <u>Outer Hebrides</u> of <u>Scotland</u>. The town's population is around 8,000, making it the largest town in the Hebrides, with a third of the population of the civil parish of Stornoway, which includes various nearby villages and has a population of approximately 12,000. Stornoway is an important port and the major town and administrative center of the Outer Hebrides. It is home to <u>Comhairle nan Eilean Siar</u> (the Western Isles Council).

Here is first the prof from Kirkwood 1899 book of the Stornoway Ship Letter. The "S" is not like the one used, see the used underneath



The "P" is a bit different from the **Aberdeen** "SHIP LETTER" – but in the real world?



Used in Stornoway 1899 Here the S is different form the proof and the "P" stil a bit different from Aberdeen.



Pór Porsteins has compiled the list of sailings paid for caring mail from Iceland, and that is the basis for the registration – but other dates can appear, but then there is no amount registered for caring the mail.

#### At the internet page Paquebot.Info:

"All the items from mid-August will have been in the batch of mail that landed in Stornoway on August 18, 1899. Most of my Stornoway items were from this (possibly) first landing of mail receiving the Stornoway "Ship Letter" mark. The boat carrying this mail must have been a private vessel, perhaps a trawler, as the travel time was so short. Contract vessels had so many stops that the voyage from Reykjavik to Copenhagen could take three weeks or more – for example the "SS CERES" left Reykjavik on July 1, 1899 and arrived in Copenhagen on July 25. The "Ship Letter" handstamp left the manufacturers (Kirkwood) at the end of June, 1899."




And then the exceptions 1) a letter to Copenhagen – but note the recipient:





On August 11 the following letter was sent from Seydisfjordur and it arrived the same day I Copenhagen, but I don't have the back – so I don't know about a possible Stornoway cancellation.



There was a corporation between Tulinius and Wattne – so it might be SS Egill being the ship – but I don't know – Egill was scheduled to leave Seidisfjordur on 9 August but not for Reykjavik and Stornoway – It is a puzzle.

Exception 2 – to England and canceled in Reykjavik 14.8.89


