This IslandsKontakt Special is a part of a series published online summarizes information published over the years in IslandsKontakt, supplemented by recent discoveries, and information published elsewhere. We must all be grateful for the sustained efforts of all those who, over the years, as Editors or Authors have contributed to the gathering and dissemination of information relevant to the philately of Iceland.

This is the "story" about mail from Iceland to the town of VEJLE in Jutland, Denmark. Vejle is a city not on the schedule of ships carrying mail from Iceland, but for special reasons ships went to Vejle in 1920 until 1925 – because they all delivered of Icelandic horses to horse dealer Carl Sørensen. Some of them (all?) carried mail canceled in Vejle.

We divide the information; **part I** is a reprint [in Danish] of the articles from Kristian Kristensen in IslandsKontakt (1994 and 1997), **part II**, by Gert Guttenberg, is focusing on "the story" and the newspaper articles; PHT 2019 no 3 page 113. **Part III** (the present one) is focusing on the ships carrying the mail and show copies of all the examples known until now.






5. "Fra Jslund" (a rubber stamp probably reproduced from a text from a type righter?) – used 6.09.1920 and 13.10.1921.

The major background for this compilation is an article in IslandsKontakt from September 1994 – IslandsKontakt # 18, and a follow-up article from January 1997 in IslandsKontakt # 25, both from Kristian Kristensen, Værløse – see IslandsKontakt or part I.

The research done by Gert Guttenberg now further develops these studies. The arrival of horses (and mail) from Iceland was a major event. It was news in the press.

1920 – START OF HORSE TRANSPORTS

An article in Visir from 11. August 1920

Botnia ³ á að fara með hestafarm til Vejle, en nú eru hestar ekki til taks, svo að skipið verður að bíða þeirra fram yfir helgi. Mun fara á mánudag.	Botnia Was going to transport horses to Vejle, but the horses has not arrived so the ship has to wait over the weekend. The ship wil leave on Monday.
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
It was SS Gullfoss I. She transported 400 horses on the first trip.


The scheduled time for a trip is 8 days. SS Island left a bit late on the 6th but came only two days late.

According to articles in Icelandic and local Vejle press, horses arrived in Vejle on 08.09.1922 – but here to no sign of mail - until recently! Now One letter an one single stamp.



The trip was announced in the Icelandic press:



Morgunblaðið - 8. September 1922

Island kom til Newcastle á þriðjudaginn og mun vera konrrð til Vejle nú.	Island came to Newcastle on Tuesday and will be in Vejle now.

The trip is not mentioned earlier. Now we know:

The beginning of the story is 17.8 in Morgenbladet:

"Esja" fer hjeðan í fyrramálið kl. 11 suður og austur um land. Vegna farþtega, sem þurfa að komast til Kaupmannahafnar, lætur Eimskipafjelagið „Esju" hitta „Goðafoss" á Reyðarfirði, sem fer svo þaðan samdægurs til Kaupmannahafnar. Utlendur póstur mun einnig verða sendur- með „Esju" hjeðan.	"Esja" går af i morgen formiddag kl. 11 syd og øst om landet. Fordi der er passagerer, der har brug for adgang til København, lader Eimskipafjelag "Esja" møder "Goðafoss" på Reyðarfirði. Den går derfra den samme dag til København. Post til udlandet vil også blive sendt med "Esja".	"Esja" goes off tomorrow morning at 11 am south and east of the country, because there are passengers who need access to Copenhagen, Eimskipafjelag lets "Esja" meet "Goðafoss" in Reyðarfirði. Posting abroad will also be sent with "Esja".
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The meeting point, Reyðarfjörðu, explain some of the mail found – from Seyðisfjörðiur and Eskifjörður



Esja fór frá Reyðarfirði kl. 7 í morgun"

Goðafoss left Seyðisfjörður, on the 19th at midnight. It meets with Esja i Reyðarfjörður on 20th august and pass Eskifjörður on its way in or out for Reyðarfjörður, on the 20th


Morgunblaðið 29. juli 1924:

"E.s. Gullfoss. Samkvæmt beiðni nokkurra farþega köm Gullfoss við í Noregi nú í útleiðinni og setti farþegana á land þar í gær morgun. Meðal þeirra er í land fóru, voru: Jón Hermannsson löggreglustjón, Bjarni Jónsson forstjóri og Ólafur Þorsteinsson læknir. Gullfoss var væntanlegur til Vejle nú í morgun og setur þar á land hesta. Hefir ferðin gengið ágætlega"

E.s. Gullfoss. Upon request from several passengers, Gullfoss stopped in Norway on his way to Vejle and put the passengers a shore land yesterday morning. Among those who went was Jón Hermannsson Police Commissioner, Bjarni Jónsson CEO and Dr. Ólafur Þorsteinsson. Gullfoss was expected to arrive to Vejle this morning with some horses as a cargo. The trip so far has gone well.

"Íslendingur" from Akureyri on 1904.08.29:

„Goðafoss“ fór á sunnudagsmorguninn áleiðis til útlanda. Meðal farþega voru Þorsteinn Sigvaldason verzlunarmaður og ungfrúrnar Guðrún Jónsdóttir og Lára Ouðjónsdóttir, öll til Kaupmannahafnar.	“ Goðafoss“ went on Sunday morning going abroad. Among the passengers were Thorsteinn Sigvaldason shopkeeper and Miss Guðrún Jónsdóttir and Lára Ouðjónsdóttir, all to Copenhagen.
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"Hænir" from Seyðisfjörður 1924.08.24

Biskupinn Dr. Jón Helgason, dvelur hér í bænum þessa dagana, kom hingað á Esju. Héðan ferhann á Goðafossi til útlanda. Biskupinn heldur guðsbjónustu hér í kvöld kl. 8.	The bishop Dr. Jón Helgason, staying here in town these days, came here with Esja. From here, he goes on Goðafoss abroad. The bishop holds worship service here tonight at 8.
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Therefore, Goðafoss must have left Seyðisfjörður after the worship service – 1924.08.25



"Visir" 1925.07.13:



"Goðafoss leaves tomorrow (Tuesday) 5 in the afternoon, west and north around the country and then abroad and "Visir" 1925.07.15: "Goðafoss came to Isafjörður at 10 am this morning."





And - that was the end of import of Icelandic horses to Carl Sørensen in Vejle.
