

HULL SHIP LETTER is used over a long period an described by Robertson<sup>2</sup> - up to 1883 seen on mail from Norway – but not from Iceland and not from Denmark even there was "STEAM FROM HULL TO COPENHAGEN & ST. PETERSBURG" with SS Victoria in 1848 (Robertson E.126B).<sup>3</sup>

HULL SHIP LETTER is well known on mail from Norway.

10 øre card from Bergen on 1/3/1889 transit stamped Hull Ship Letter on 4/3/1889 and Ship-Letter Paid London on 4/3/1889 to London, England. Transported by the Wilson Line steamship S/S "Argo" which departed from Bergen via Stavanger to Hull on 2/3/1889.

From 1876 until 1895 a special cancelation was used on mail coming from Sweden and Norway<sup>5</sup>.





In 1880 Hull is used by the mail ships from Denmark on their way up to Iceland. In "ÁRBÓK ÍSLANDS 1880" from 16<sup>th</sup> January: "Póstgufuskipið Phönix leggur af stað frá Khöfn til Islands aukaferð; kemur við í Hull og þórshöfn."

Later Hull was occasionally used on mail from Iceland, but it became an important "steppingstone" in the transport from Iceland to Europe when Eimskipsfelag started to include Hull in their schedule in late 1920.

For the period from 1903 until 1911 Þór Þorsteins has compiled the list on sailings paid for carrying mail from Iceland with the following information:

His findings are included in the following – but there are more to add and investigate. I start in:

#### 1893

"Önundarfirðir benefited from the activity of the DAN association." One was that the company's steamship, Cimbria, which was carrying iced fish from Flateyri to Hull also carried mail between the countries during these trips. Such mail transports from the Westfjords to Hull will have started in 1893 and they were continued in the following years. The mails with Cimbria were, however, illegal because the United Steamship Company then had the exclusive license for all mail transport to and from Iceland. During the summer months, however, Cimbria's journeys were different more frequent than the trips of the coastal cruise ships that take mail for the United Steamship Company."



#### 1896

"The fishing vessel, Cimbria, which spends most of the year in frequent trips here from England, arrived on the 10th this month .. on the way out . Then headed for England the same evening."  $^9$ 

"Coal and float fishing is now engaged in the Danish Fishing Association in Frederikshavn ... (has) this summer 6 sailing ships on coal fishing here in the west, and 4 steamships (2 Danish and 2 English). — These ships have its main station at Önundarfjörður, and has steamer "Roma," Captain Bast, who lay this summer at Flateyri harbor with ice etc. supplies needed. The steamers "Gipsy" and "Cimbria" are

stable transits between Flateyri and Hull river England, in order to transfer the catch equally hard on the market, so that steamship trips are now from Flateyri to England every week.<sup>10</sup>

#### 1901

The steamship "Cimbria" makes various trips between Flateyri this summer and Hull in England and are planning days of the ship from Flateyri: 23 May, 6 June, 20 June, July 4, July 18, Aug. 1 and 15th Aug.; but when the tours will stop this summer has not yet been decided.

The post clerk in Isafjörður always sends mail to Flateyri the day before the ship's departure, and these trips are therefore of great benefit to Isafjörður.



"As in the past summers Isafjörður have their postal transport abroad, where the steamship "Cimbria" goes from Flateyri in Önundarfjörður to Hull.

The departure days of the ship from are: May 22, June 5, June 19, July 3, July 17, July 31 and August 14, and from Hull the ship leaves for Flateyri: May 28, June 11, June 26, July 9, July 23, Aug 6 and August 20.

Mail is sent from Isafjörður the day before the ship's departure from Flateyri." (Þjóðviljinn + Þjóðviljinn ungi 03.06.1902)

Swedish steamer of 1515 grt, built at J. Readhead & Co., South Shields in 1883, as build number 191. The ship's first name was Derwentdale and it was based in Scarborough, England. In the year 1900, the ship was sold to Germany and was based here in Stettin, until 1907 when it was sold to Sweden, in which trade the name was changed to Polaris.

**SS Arcturus** was a passenger ship of the <u>Finland Steamship Company</u> operating primarily on the route between Hanko, Finland and Hull, England via Copenhagen, Denmark.


